

GETTING HELP AFTER A SEXUAL ASSAULT IN THE HOOPER BAY AREA

If you have been sexually assaulted and need urgent medical attention, go immediately to your village clinic.

If you want to report to law enforcement, please call Alaska State Troopers at 907-543-2294.

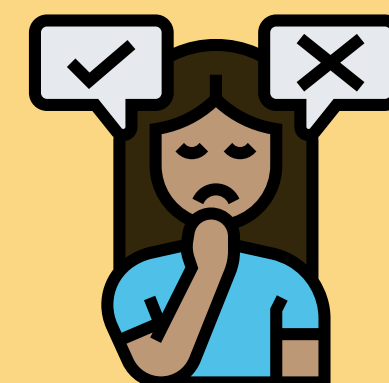
Regardless of whether or not you choose to report, you can ask a Bay Haven Shelter Victim Services Advocate about what your options are or learn more about the process by calling 907-758-2870.

Decide if you want to report to law enforcement. It is 100% your decision whether or not to report to the Alaska State Troopers if you are 18 years of age or older.

You may request for the team to hold your kit and make an anonymous report, but you have the right to report any time within the statute of limitations.

For evidence collection ("evidence kit"), in case you decide to report to the Alaska State Troopers, try to avoid the following things:

- Showering
- Taking a maqi (steam)
- Urinating or having a bowel movement
- Eating/drinking or smoking
- Chewing gum or iqmi
- Brushing teeth or washing/changing clothes



DO bring your clothes, including underwear, with you to the exam.

Alaska State Troopers or the Bay Haven Advocate will arrange for when you will go to the Hooper Bay Subregional Clinic.

The exam will be conducted after normal business hours.

You will have the opportunity to have all your questions answered by a provider or an advocate before the exam begins.



5

If you choose to receive free STI/HIV and pregnancy prevention medications, the provider will run some lab tests to make sure it is safe for you to take these medications.

You will also receive referrals for follow-up care.



6

Receive ongoing support and connection to resources.

If you choose, a Bay Haven Advocate will continue to support you in any way that you want and can connect you to basic resources, educational, legal, and/or social services.
